

HSUS may be forced to shift from aggressive attack to self defense

Washington, April 1 – The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) may have to turn its attention from attacking slaughter houses and poultry operations to self defense. That’s because a group called HumaneWatch, which boasts that it is “Keeping a watchful eye” on HSUS, is hard at work digging up the dirt on HSUS – and publicizing its findings with a series of ads. It’s latest ad, saying HSUS “shares less and 1 percent of your donations with local pet shelters,” appeared in the April 1 edition of *USA Today*.

Earlier ads have appeared in the *New York Times* and in Washington, DC bus shelters. HumanWatch also uses its <http://humanewatch.org> web site to detail its criticisms with attention-grabbing postings such as these:

- “If you're looking for evidence that HSUS shares less than one-half of one percent of its budget with hands-on pet shelters, you've come to the right place.”
- “Click here to read about the federal racketeering (RICO) lawsuit that HSUS and its lawyers are facing.”
- “And don't forget to look at the national polling which shows that most Americans are confused about what HSUS is—and what it isn't.”
