Dear Food and Agriculture Climate Alliance:

Thank you for sharing your letter to Congressional leadership regarding the latest budget reconciliation package with the leaders of the House and Senate Agriculture Committees. As the Republican Members of the Agriculture Committees in our respective chambers, we welcome the opportunity to hear from FACA members on their priorities. America's farmers, ranchers, forestland owners, and rural communities have always, and must continue to play a central role in the development of legislation impacting their livelihoods.

Our Committees have a long history of bipartisanship. We share your belief "that widespread support strengthens any legislation." Farm bills, child nutrition reauthorizations, and other major legislation have started their paths to enactment with members of both parties working collaboratively. This work is informed by public hearings with significant input from stakeholders, many of whom have joined your alliance. Reconciliation should demand no less. In fact, due to reconciliation's procedural limitations, including those on debate, it is even more important that the process undertaken at the committee level be public. Unfortunately, with less than two weeks until the House Agriculture Committee is scheduled to mark up this legislation, not one public hearing on the package has been held. Republican Members, along with the many individuals and stakeholders, remain shut out of the process.

This current reconciliation process, like the previous package (P.L. 117-2), is entirely partisan and only involves new spending—at an extraordinary level. This level, \$135 billion, is comparable to the total spending on agricultural support and conservation programs in the last five-year farm bill. Like your members, we are deeply concerned about the impact that a hasty and partisan reconciliation bill of this size will have on the long-term viability of existing farm bill programs. We are equally concerned with the consequences that misguided tax policies will have on multi-generational agricultural family businesses.

In support of your call for bipartisanship and broad buy-in for farm bill programs, we ask that you join us in calling upon our Committees to convene public hearings to hear directly from our nation's farmers, ranchers, forest landowners, and representatives from our rural communities. We also believe it is important for both committees to hold business meetings where members have an opportunity to discuss the legislation and offer amendments. The current closed-door Washington, D.C. based process is elitist and disrespectful to those who produce the food and fiber our country depends upon. We sincerely hope this is not the path Chairs Stabenow and Scott choose to follow.

Thank you for your consideration of our request. We look forward to the opportunity for America's farmers, ranchers, forestland owners, and rural communities to have their voices heard.
