The undersigned organizations are writing to urge the Committee to begin the legislative process to address the issue of decarbonizing the transportation fuel sector in support of a national goal of net-zero greenhouse gas emissions economy-wide not later than 2050. Without immediate action in the 117th Congress, that goal is very likely unattainable.

A strong national clean fuels policy that sends clear long-term and durable signals will encourage rapidly growing investment in the technologies needed to simultaneously reduce criteria and carbon pollution in all communities across America. Designed properly, it will spur innovation, create jobs, and ensure equitable and sustainable economic growth, as well as smooth the transition to a cleaner and more just zero-carbon future.
